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Minuets – Fishing Boat

The kit is worked in cross-stitch with both two and one strand of stranded cotton, and in half cross stitch with one strand. Work over two threads of the material on linen or one block if working on Aida. The fabric is over dyed on one side, make sure you use this side.

Bind the edges of the fabric to prevent fraying.

Start to work at the centre of the material, fold it in half both lengthwise and horizontally to find the central point. The arrows on the chart → ↘ indicate the central threads.

The cotton is divided into two twists to aid the sorting of the colours. Knot the thread onto the hole card and draw the symbol next to the hole.

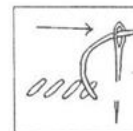
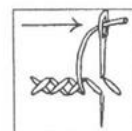
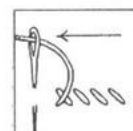
Cross Stitch Instructions

If a row of stitches is to be worked, the stitches may all be worked in one direction, then worked over with stitches taking the other diagonal to form a cross.

Alternatively each stitch can be worked individually. It is important for a neat appearance that all top stitches lie in the same direction; as half cross stitch is also used it is neater to have the top stitches laying in the same direction as the half cross stitch i.e. bottom left to top right.

Half Cross Stitch



Back stitch with 1 strand of
905 Dark Brown
on the masts and the cabin windows

Add the rigging to the masts with
399 Mid grey 1 strand
Work long stitches - work the more
distant mast first.

Work long stitches with 2 strands of
372 Sand
for the mast supports and the rope.
Allow the rope to hang naturally and
attach with a few small stitches

Emphasise the cabin roof with
310 Tan 2 strands back stitch

On the seagulls back stitch
399 Mid Grey 2 strands
399 Mid grey 1 strand
02 White 2 strands
1048 Orange Tan 1 strand
work a tiny stitch for their beaks

Emphasise the hull of the boat with
851 Very Dark Sea Green 1 strand
